



God Answers When I Call!


They will call on Me, and I will answer them. Psalm 91: 15a

HE THIRD BONUS PROMISE from God is to answer those who truly love Him and call on His name. If we ask something in Jesus' Name, it has to be according to His Will, because His Name and His Will and His Word are the same.

We can come to God with no doubts. This means that when we ask God for things (and if those things agree with what God wants for us), then God cares about what we say. God listens to us every time we ask Him. So we know that He gives us the things that we ask from Him.

I John 5: 14-15

Just think about what that verse is saying to you. Do you realize that every time you pray a prayer that lines up with God's Word, He hears you? And because He hears you, you can know He will give you whatever you ask. Wow! That one promise should keep us always trying to find out what God's Word says so we can pray exactly according to His Will.

I am going to let James Zintgraff tell this next miracle in his own words:

OThe Summer that Cullen was five years old, I was swimming with him and his cousins in their pool. One of the adults had said, "OK, everyone out of the pool." Everyone else had headed inside the house when Cullen saw a plastic life raft come floating by. He said, "Hey, James, watch this," as he stepped off the side of the pool onto the raft like it was a solid piece. It flipped out from under him, and he fell backwards into the water, grazing his head on the side of the pool as he fell.

It was the deep end of the pool, and I watched Cullen, with his arms and legs outstretched, just start sinking to the bottom. I dived in and grabbed him under the arms, but he is unusually big for his age—and weighed more than I did. His dad always said that he felt like a chunk of lead when you tried to lift him, so I wondered if I could get him to the top of the water—especially since he must have been dazed from scraping his head on the concrete.

I knew we were in trouble so I called on God, and suddenly, I felt someone grab me from behind and begin pushing Cullen and me straight up from the bottom of the pool. (I thought one of the adults had seen us and dived in to help me.) I shot up out of the water with Cullen above me. Then it was like someone pulled Cullen from my arms and laid him on the side of the pool. (I was in water way over my head, so there was no way I could have lifted dead weight out of the pool.) Cullen started crying and coughing, and when I looked around, no one was there—absolutely, no one! I knew God had heard me call, and He had sent an angel to answer my call.

By this time the adults came running out of the house to see if we were OK. They treated me like a hero, and I was given a plaque that says, "James Zintgraff saved Cullen Ruth's life," but I knew that I could not have done that rescue alone. I was only an eleven year old kid. I know God heard me and sent His angel to answer my call.

The next time you are in the deep end of a swimming pool, try getting under someone and lifting him out of the water—without touching the sides or bottom of the pool. It is next to impossible. Trained lifeguards would have difficulty doing what James did,



but his secret was calling on God. And God was big enough to lift both Cullen and James.


Have you ever lost something valuable and just gave up and never prayed about it because everyone said it was too late? One day we came home and found that the car belonging to our teenagers had been stolen from the carport. When we prayed and asked God to return the car, He told us to choose to forgive the one who took it. That was hard at first, but we remembered that forgiveness is a choice, not a feeling, and we made a sincere choice to forgive the person

who had taken from us. Forgiving them didn't seem to help the situation. The sheriff's department told us they didn't think we would



ever see the car again since it had been gone for almost a week. It was hard to ignore that negative report, but as a family we sat around the kitchen table and came into agreement that God would do a miracle. We knew that even if we never saw the car again, we would still love and trust God, but we didn't want the devil to win. And sure enough, after one week a man turned himself in and said he had stolen things all of his life, but this was the first time he had ever felt guilty. He told us he had left the car on the parking lot of the rodeo grounds in a nearby town. When we drove up, there it was—exactly where he had said. We called on God, and, just like He promised, He answered.

Chapter 17

God Rescues Me From Trouble! $\odot\odot\odot$

I will be with them in trouble and I will rescue them. Psalm 91: 15

◀ HE FOURTH PROMISE TO the one who loves God is to be rescued from trouble. Have you ever been in trouble and needed to be rescued? When I think of God rescuing us when we are in trouble, I always think of this story of my son.

We had a flood in Brownwood several years ago, and Bill had a herd of goats on the land by the river. The flood waters came up so quickly that the water overflowed the banks, and his goats had no way to get to higher ground. Thankfully, some old ranchers happened to see them and were able to get them hoisted up into the loft of a barn before they drowned.

It was so deep and swift by the time Bill got to the edge of those flood waters the police wouldn't allow anyone through the road blocks. Thinking the goats had been washed away in the flood, you can imagine how happy Bill was when someone told him they were in the loft of a barn across the river. He knew,




however, that they would suffocate—all closed up in that loft with no water and hardly any air—if he didn't get to them soon. So he found a little tin bottom boat and went out across those dangerously swift, flood waters to rescue his goats that were in trouble.


Bill had bottle fed one of the goats after its mother died and named him Little Willie. As Bill got close to the barn, he recognized Little Willie, crying out louder than all the others. It took a while to get the loft door open while standing in the boat with the water rushing by on each side—but the moment it came loose, Little Willie was the first one to jump into his arms. Bill was able to pull the goats down into the boat a few at a time, and then—boat load by boat load—he rowed them all back to safety.

There was a TV crew from Abilene filming the flood, and Bill and his goats made a great news story that day. Everyone listening to the six o'clock news, and then again at ten o'clock, watched the little goat boy as he rescued all of his goats.

I never think of Bill rescuing those goats that were in trouble without thinking of how God sees us, like Little Willie, calling out in our troubles. And when we do, God always finds a way to rescue us. Aren't you thankful that we have a loving heavenly Father who rescues us out of our troubles? Whatever trouble you find yourself in, remember that nothing is too big for God. But you have to run to Him—not away from Him.

Sometimes a person will think their being rescued was just a lucky break. When we are trusting God, there are no lucky breaks. It is God seeing us in trouble and coming to our rescue.





God Honors Me!

I will honor them.

Psalm 91: 15

HE FIFTH PROMISE TO those who love God is to be honored. Do you like to be honored? Of course you do! Maybe you can remember a time when a teacher called your name in school and bragged on the homework you turned in. That made you feel good. That was an honor.

Most schools have an Awards Day and different students are given special awards. When your name is called out, and an award is handed to you in front of all the other students, it is an honor. Cullen was thrilled when his teacher called him up last year and gave him a special award. Awards Day is one of the highlights and most eagerly awaited days of the entire school year, whether it be a grade school or university assembly. A student may use any excuse to miss other school days—but not Awards Day, especially if he thinks he will get an honor. Have you ever watched people's faces just beam when their name is called out. Most schools give awards for everything from academics to sports trophies to recognition for science projects, all because people like to be honored.



Psalm 91: 16a

HE SIXTH PROMISE IS that God will give the one who loves Him a long, full life. God does not want us to simply have a lot of birthdays. Chapter 20

I Can See God's Salvation

They will see how I can save. Psalm 91: 16b

O SEE THE SALVATION of the Lord means to reach out and take hold of it make it a part of your life. Many people are surprised when they look up the word saved or salvation in the Bible. Do you know what it means? Most people just think it means a ticket to get into heaven. It means that, but it means so much more. The word salvation also means health, healing, deliverance, protection, and provision in this life. That means you can live in health, but if you happen to get sick, then God will give you healing. It means He will deliver you from evil things that are causing you to be unhappy. He will protect you from harm, and He will provide everything you need to have a full life. A person who doesn't know God might think this is impossible, but that is just because he doesn't know the faithfulness of our powerful God.

As you learn how to trust God for His healing and deliverance and protection, other people will watch you and start learning how to trust God, too. We had What salvation means

his bed, not realizing that his weight was going to break the rabbit's neck. That sad experience was probably why he always wanted animals around when he was grown and why he made sure all the grandchildren had pets. Often we would catch him putting a grandbaby, still in diapers, on the back of one of his goats. As we got older, riding that goat while holding onto its horns was more fun than a carousel.

In high school dad became the city boxing champion and held that title until someone secretly brought in a professional boxer who took Dad down. The newspaper had a picture of my dad, the town champion, knocked out and lying flat on his back. The headlines read, "The Mighty Crow Has Fallen."

Dad was the star player on his Howard Payne College football team. I read newspaper articles my mother had pasted in her scrapbook that called Dad The Tank. One article said, "Crow looked like an army tank going through a corn field, mowing down everything in its pathway." Dad's football years were before extreme hazing was outlawed, so he went through some really tough punishment. I've heard him talk about the belt lines where they were told to strip down and carry a torch in the dark while being made to run between two lines of older football players who popped them with belts as they ran past. Dad was good at what he did. He was even offered a contract to play for the Green Bay Packers, but he turned it down to marry my mother during his last year

at college. He served in World War II and then came home to a loving wife and raised three children who adored him. He became the father to his children that he always wished he had.

God was abundantly blessing him, but something was missing. He was such a good man with Godly morals that I didn't realize while I was living at home that he had not yet seen His Salvation!

You can imagine the surprise and joy I felt the day he called, asking me to come to his baptism that night. And what a difference it made! He had always been a good, loving person; but from that day forward, his entire life changed. He would witness about Jesus to everyone he met, take food to people on his mail route who were in need, repair mail boxes for the elderly, slip candy to the children... He loved God with his whole heart, soul, mind and strength, and he didn't mind the world knowing it. When he went home to be with the Lord, his Bible told the story of his new life because it was covered with highlighted passages and notes in the margins—painting a picture of the *love walk* that he enjoyed with his heavenly Father. He had indeed SEEN THE SALVATION OF THE LORD.

There are promises all through the Bible, but this is the only place where all of the promises of protection are gathered together in one chapter. Psalm 91 is a covenant (promise) of protection for any of God's children



who will love Him and trust Him to do what He says.

The world gives us a 911 number to call if we get in trouble, but God has done better than that. He has given us Psalm 91:1. My prayer is that you will use this book as a handbook and study this Psalm 91 until every fear is driven out of your life. God wants you to know He will be faithful to bring about every one of these promises, if you will be faithful to Him. He wants more than anything for you to see and take hold of His Salvation.


